SURVIVING AND ARRIVING

As Jacob's favored son, Joseph never really had a chance to discover the outer limits of his character (Ge. 37:1-36). Now, as a powerless slave living in a foreign land, Joseph will be tested both spiritually and physically.

Instead of killing Joseph, his brothers sell him to a band of Midianites traveling to Egypt. The Midianites, in turn, sell the boy to Potiphar, a commander in the Egyptian army who was also one of Pharaoh's officials. Joseph starts a new existence as a common house domestic doing menial jobs. Over time his effort was noted. He rose to a positions of greater responsibility until he became steward of all his master's possessions.

Joseph proves to be a person of sound moral principle as made manifest when he resisted the advances of Potiphar's wife (Gen. 39:7-20). What could be more contemporary and relevant than this instance of sexual harassment in the workplace? Ironically, the Bible highlights this issue in which a male member of the staff is the victim of harassment. What Joseph surely knew was that this person had the power to destroy him. It would be disastrous for a slave to disregard the overtures of his master's wife.

Joseph flees the household. His coat is left in this woman's hand. Yet again, another coat stripped off his back. Instead of the pit which followed with his brothers, this is followed by descending into the pit of the royal prison. It's as if Joseph is being repeatedly shedding his skin as he lowered from his father's favor into enslavement then lowered again from slavery into imprisonment.

Only after Joseph is stripped of all privileges and sold into slavery does his character begin to develop and emerge. In every generation of the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation, the one who can control their nature wins out over those who are enslaved by their urges.

Joseph did not leave the pit of his brothers and exit Canaan enslaved by the Midianite travelers totally empty handed. An alien living in a foreign land with no rights nor powers, Joseph transcends his predicament because "the Lord was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love" (Gen. 39:21).

Soren Kierkegaard's perspective defines despair "as the rejection of God within oneself." Despite the depths to which human treachery consigns him, Joseph does not experience despair or bitterness. He never relinquishes moral integrity. Not unlike how Viktor Frankl made the following statement about survivors of the German concentration camps: "Everything can be taken from a man but one thing: the last of the human freedoms, to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances."

Rather than give in to depravity or wallow in depression, Joseph begins to build a ladder of out the depths. We witness him developing the very characteristics lacking earlier in his life: empathy and sensitivity – these enable him to discern the fears and anxieties that torment the baker and chief cupbearer (Gen. 40:1-23).

Joseph's personal transformation teaches us why so many gifted but immature people fall away. Talent and intellect are not enough to carry one over the inevitable pits that accompany life's path. Character as displayed by Christ and deep Christian faith can get us through.

Parents find it difficult to give their children, whether age 5 years or 50 years, the necessary freedom to fail or deal with adversity on their own, to watch them struggle without rushing to the rescue. At times, it is the adversity which matures character and develops new growth within the soul.
