Life Together

What kind of new senior minister are we looking for?

As most of you know, the Senior Minister Search Committee recently asked you to respond to a survey in which you could pick only 8 qualities from a list of 19. I'm sure you wanted to include all 19, but that's the way survey prioritization works. I thought you would be interested in the results. Elmer Jackson gave me permission to share this information with the congregation. With 80 survey responses, here are your priorities:

- 1. Delivers effective, meaningful sermons (63 votes)
- 2. Has strong pastoral care qualities (60 votes)
- 3. Approachable (56 votes)
- 4. Actively supports children/youth (56 votes)
- 5. Capable and eager to bring new members to FCC (52 votes)
- 6. Has a vision for the future of the church (50 votes)
- 7. Builds a strong sense of fellowship (46 votes)
- 8. Motivates church staff and lay leaders (45 votes)
- 9. Creative in planning and leading worship services (40 votes)
- 10. Has a deep devotional/prayer life (30 votes)
- 11. Involved in the local community (30 votes)
- 12. Good administrator (28 votes)
- 13. Emphasizes local missions (17 votes)
- 14. Actively involved in Disciples of Christ, both regionally and generally (12 votes)
- 15. Good steward (10 votes)
- 16. Takes a stand on social issues (9 votes)
- 17. Computer literate (8 votes)
- Emphasizes outreach beyond our local community (7 votes)
- 19. Commitment to self-care (maintaining health and wellness) (6 votes)

As I look at the results of this survey, it seems to accurately reflect this church as I know it. Those first two items seem to represent the largest share of any pastor's work day and are the two items with the biggest impact on the congregation.

Once I get past those two most important functions, I feel there could be a healthy discussion about the rest. For example, the last item, number 19, is "Commitment to selfcare." Everyone would agree that they don't want their pastor melting down or having a mental breakdown because of the stress of the work at church. That's the last thing anyone would want for their pastor. You really do want the pastors to take care of themselves. But you only got to choose your top 8 items! A similar case could be made for any of the items on the list.

I was interested that item number 16 "Takes a stand on social issues" appeared so low. I think that reflects some conflict that has occurred over social issues in this church, and the church is saying, "We don't want conflict." But I doubt that you were really saying you don't want to take a stand on important social issues.

The other item I would call your attention to is item number 12 "Good administrator." If I had filled out the survey, that item would be much higher because I happen to have first hand knowledge of the administrative requirements of this job. This is a busy church with a large staff which requires a serious effort in administration by the senior pastor. In my opinion, a senior minister who had no interest in administration would not be a good fit for this job.

Any prioritized survey will have issues like this because all the items are important. One of my mentors said that the pastor must be a generalist in an age of specialists. Medical students quite often "specialize" in limited areas of medicine, but the best pastor is not one who specializes in any of the items on the list, but one who is generally capable in all of them.

I believe this survey gives a good view of where our congregation is right now. It should be very helpful to our Search Committee and to prospective pastors.

Let's continue to pray for the Search Committee as they carry on their important work.

March Board Summary

- Financial Reports: A written report was submitted from the Finance Committee, including the February and YTD 2022 financial statements for the General Budget and the Restricted Funds.
 - General Budget: Pledges and offerings were \$6467.02 less than budget. The General Endowment income is being received monthly. Retirement and Payroll Tax Expense and gas expense were not listed and the plan is to list these expenses every month in the future. Starting next month, the Property and Liability Insurance expenses will be broken down instead of showing as just Property Insurance. There is a \$9908.45 surplus YTD. However it would be closer to even if these expenses were listed.
 - Restricted Funds: Reviewed several line items for an understanding of the use of the funds.
 - ♦ Eighteen (18) guest instrumentalists for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday will be paid a total of \$2250.00 this was provided for in the development of the 2022 budget.
- Grace Gardens: Church of Healing Chair David May reported that FCC had been contacted in regard to grant funds that may be available for use toward garden expenses. David will pursue this. Some of the tall raised beds are rotting and need repair and David will obtain estimates. Many thanks to Sue Ann Rice for working on the garden again this year. She will be planting in mid-May.
- Property: Property Chair Jack Jones will pursue organ repair with Music Director Larry Davidson and Organist Harry Mercer. The steeple has a leak and a roofing contractor has been contacted. There are numerous property projects being addressed both in the building and on the grounds. A clean-up day is planned for April 9.
- Rev. Catherine DeMoss reported that the Baptism Class has been terrific and the mentors greatly appreciated. She has been working on lots of details so others can pick up some of her duties. Much appreciation was expressed for the amazing support she has received from the church during her illness and her decision to go on disability. Rev. Catherine will be greatly missed and board members expressed their desire to keep in touch.
- Outreach: Outreach Co-Chair Patricia Calvert invited Greenhouse 17 Director Darlene Thomas to address
 the board in regard to the possibility of FCC meeting the needs of their organization. Ms. Thomas had toured
 our building and determined it might fill their need for a locked office space and a group space for meetings.
 Facilities Administrator Stephen Hinkle will look around the church for possible locations and Patricia, Stephen, and Darlene will work together overall.
- Children's Ministries Director Patti Wright updated the board that Kid's Club and the Windjammer Trip have been very successful. Patti thanked the volunteers for their great help and also expressed appreciation to all volunteers who assist with Worship & Wonder and Children's Church.
- Interim Senior Minister Dr. Mickey Anders updated the board that he has contacted 261 people related to the church and is providing pastoral care.

Security Update

All church exterior doors with the exception of the gym will be open on Sunday mornings until 11:00am for the safety of the church and especially our children in different areas (Children's Church and Children Worship & Wonder). The main front sanctuary doors and arcade door will remain open during the entire worship service.
