Life Together

Thank you so much for the kind reception held for me and Sarah on the 17th. And a special thank you to the Connections Team headed by Margaret Clark. In spite of masks, we had a good group to show up and express kindest regards about my coming as your interim pastor.

My granddaughter was shocked that I would go to work again after having retired twice before. Her comment was, "Grandpa! Does this mean when you finish this job you will retire for the third time??"

She's right. I just can't seem to get retirement right. But there are others in our church who are having trouble getting retirement right as well.

When I found out that Eben Henson was at retirement age, I asked him why he didn't retire. He was a bit shocked by my question, stumbled a bit, and finally said, "You know, I don't think anybody in my family ever did retire!" And it's true! His dad ran the dinner theater right up until his death, and his mom is still working there.

Tom Hensley is beyond retirement age, and when I asked him about still working he replied, "I believe continuing to work keeps you alive longer." He's right that quitting everything and sitting around is bad for one's health.

Some people seem to be able to get retirement right and enjoy it, but others of us don't. I am surprised that I fall in the latter category. I am surprised because I yearned for retirement as early as my thirties. Retirement was always my goal. It represented the idyllic future out there after my working days.

I tease my friends and say that my retirement was about ChessBibleBowlBike, all one word. I kept myself busy studying chess, which I have now done for 322 days straight according to my Chessable app. I learned to make wooden bowls on a lathe. I made fifty of them and gave them all away. I rode my motorcycle often. In fact, I have taken 83 rides so far this year. And for fun, I was reading through the 14,000-page New Interpreter's Bible Commentary. I had completed about 2,500 pages when Danville called.

So why would a guy who has retired twice and was busy

with ChessBibleBowlBike come back to First Christian Church of Danville as the Interim Minister again?

I think my answer is the same answer you would give if someone asked why you would take a position of service on one of the church committees. Why would a busy person willingly take on a volunteer responsibility at church? Why would you say, "Yes" to a request from the Nominating Committee? It's far easier to just sit on the pew and be self-satisfied.

I think we both say, "Yes" because we love this church. I do. And I think you do too. This church is filled with so many kind and wonderful people! It brings me great joy to simply be involved in Life Together with you. And serving on committees at church gives you the opportunity to be involved in meaningful ways with other good people in this church. You should see the camaraderie that takes place at Soups on Us while people are folding boxes, ladling soup into bowls, or packing the sandwiches into the boxes. The happy faces are unmistakable. It might not be nearly as much fun if we were doing all that work alone. "Together" is the key word in my column title, "Life Together."

I also think we say, "Yes" because we want to make a difference. Terry Dachenhaus told me he has enjoyed serving as co-chair of the Outreach Team for two years because he felt like he was making a difference. I enjoyed ChessBibleBowlBike, but it wasn't really making a difference in the lives of other people. Some people enjoy just sitting on the pew, but they may not be making a difference in other people's lives.

And ultimately we are both serving God through work in God's church. There are probably many more reasons for us to get out of retirement or get off the pew and serve. But maybe it is also like the Bible said in the text for the sermon last Sunday:

Like Jesus, we are here to serve, and not to be served.


