Pastor's Note

Matthew 25:8-13 (NRSVUE) 8 The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9 But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' 10 And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. 11 Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' 12 But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' 13 Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

When was the last time something surprising happened? Some say, "Nothing surprises me anymore."

It's a common sentiment that the Covid-19 worldwide pandemic was a big surprise. Seems an unlike take in light of the recent past.

At this time of the year, thoughts turn to returning to school and the Labor Day holiday weekend. When a plan is made it seems inevitable that an unexpected surprise is encountered.

The Bible is filled with evidence of how God is the God of the unexpected.

Consider Sarah and Abraham. The Lord appeared to Abraham as he sat at the entrance to his tent. Abraham saw three men standing nearby. He and Sarah no longer had hope of having a child. When Sarah overheard the Lord

telling Abraham that she would have a child, she laughed as she knew such a time had long passed. God made it so where Sarah not only gave birth, she was provided with even strength to raise the boy.

Gideon, belonged to the least tribe of Israel's 12. Within the least tribe, his was the least clan. Within the least clan, Gideon's was the least family. Within the least family of the least clan of the least tribe he was the least of his brothers. Consider his surprise when God revealed he would be the one to free Israel.

Doubts, second thoughts and disbelief walls away just how God can surprise. We set expectations too low. We become satisfied with mediocrity. We go to God to patch our clothes when God wishes to provide us a new garment. It's not like God doesn't have the power. Do you want a patch or do you want new clothing?

Some Organ Updates

Many of you have mentioned over the last few months your eagerness and interest as to how the organ project is going. So here are some points of interest for you to ponder.

1. The console shell is at the Phoenix factory in Canada and is in process of being retrofitted with all of the new technology and hardware. All materials for the upgrade are in-house and ready for installation with one major exception—The DRAWKNOB assemblies. These "knobs" are what engage or silence the the voices (ranks) the organist uses [to turn ON or OFF] at the console. The drawknob assemblies for our newly refurbished organ are being manufactured by the Harris Company in California. Harris is one of the major suppliers for organ technology in the world. They make the best!

Their equipment works flawlessly and has a very long life of uninterrupted service.

We are in the queue with Harris for our new drawknobs and will hopefully very soon have that final piece of the puzzle in place. By the way, our newly refurbished console will have a total of 59 drawknobs over the 4 divisions of the organ.

2. When these final components are in the hands of the factory, they will be installed and the console will then be shipped to the church at which time Oldham Organs will begin their task of installing the new systems to control the operation of our beautiful organ. Many wires must be connected, speaking pipes must be re-connected to wind chests, pipes will need tuning and adjusting, and many other artistic and mechanical decisions dealt with. All of this expertise will go into play to produce the final product to which we are all so excited to be looking.

PATIENCE is difficult! And, the organist is probably THE most impatient one among us these days. We will all be glad once more when all the pieces come together and our beautiful organ is back in its place and doing its part in our Worship of God!
