Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand.

When I first began my journey into ministry, I noticed that congregations seem to have a bias towards younger people. I noticed how leaders and many members of the church were fixated on how to get young families in the building. And whenever people under 35 years old showed up at the sanctuary doors, they were given the five-star treatment. If they joined the congregation, they were quickly nominated for service and leadership positions. I remember how my own family was quickly embraced by the church when we started attending regularly.

While I think that it is wonderful that young individuals and young families are embraced by today's congregations, and while I certainly hope it continues, I worry sometimes that we neglect our more senior members. I have heard a certain stereotype over the years that older church members are "stuck in their ways" and afraid of change. My experience in ministry, however, tells a completely different story. Many of the members I have served who have been in the church for several decades, have witnessed and facilitated more change than you can imagine. The difference with our older members is that they have acquired something along the way that younger people oftentimes don't have: wisdom. They know the value in being deliberate. They know better than most the danger of getting swept up in an unvetted fad. And I think their feelings are subject to being hurt when the church so quickly dismisses them for something or someone new and shiny.

Of course, I know that those of you who are reading fit into different age groups, including the senior member population. For those of you who do, I hope that I am accurate in my assessment.

Here's where I am going with all of this: we need wisdom. We need wisdom now more than ever. I absolutely

value the energy and fresh inspiration that youth brings, but we need wisdom to test and temper that energy so that our world will continue to flourish.

In these difficult times, I am looking not only to innovative ideas but for reassurance from those of us who have been around for a while that we have been in difficult places before and we found a way out. That is what gives me hope. I need to hear the voices of those who have been through political uncertainty, social unrest, and invisible threats. I want to know that our generation is not completely unique in history, and I want to hear the stories of how we overcame years ago. Of course, that doesn't mean that time runs backwards or that it is possible to go back to some mythical glory in the past. But I do believe that each generation's struggles contain wisdom buried within them, and if we don't uncover and carry forward that wisdom, we are condemned to repeat the same struggles until we do.

I don't need to enumerate all of today's challenges, you know what they are. But I do want to encourage you to hold on and have faith. The Bible contains the story of God's people journeying from hardship to hardship, many of which are self-imposed. And yet God never abandons them. And you—especially those of you who have been around for a while—are full of the stories of how God's people continue to overcome obstacles and triumph over challenges. We need those stories. We need to hear about how God never abandoned us. We need that hope.

Personally, I've seen too many miracles to ever give up hope. I've known too many people to rise above their circumstances to ever give up hope. I've heard too many stories of courage and humility, of service and of love. to ever give up hope. If you have stories like that, please share them with anyone who will listen. Now is the time to en-

courage someone. Now is the time to put your hard-won wisdom to work in service to the Kingdom of God. And may God continue to bless this church.

October Board Summary

• Financial Report:

- * Contributions were down \$6000.00 for September and down \$46,000.00 year to date. Due to the endowment revenue and forgivable \$34,500.00 Small Business Loan via the Cares Act, revenue is \$11,585.00 greater than budget, hence finances are holding their own despite lower contributions. The forgivable loan was used for church payroll and utilities and it is expected the loan does not have to be repaid. Expenses were \$10,500.00 less than budget for September and \$46,107.00 less than budget year to date.
- * Electricity continues to be over budget due to a rate increase and overestimate of savings from new HVAC system.
- * Audit is planned on 2019 books due to upcoming retirement of Business Administrator.
- * Total pledges through September are currently 22% behind and Capital Campaign pledges are currently 20% behind.
- * Stewardship Campaign is underway and pledges may be returned by mail, email, phone call, drop off, or worship.

· Senior Minister:

- * Live streaming going well; if it is necessary to go back to no in-person services, live streaming will continue.
- * Bethany Fellows offered a grant for up to \$1000.00 for updating technology (live streaming) and Pastor Joey has applied for it.
- Property several projects are being planned and others are in the works including replacement of overhead lights in CLC, sealing and painting of front columns, and requesting donations for a landscaping project.
- Personnel presented information regarding upcoming job search for Business Administrator including presentation of the Job Description.
- Discussion as to how best church can support new Associate Minister.
- Vice-Chair Doug McMurry will lead the Nominating Committee.
- Elders have completed their 2021 Elder Election process with the slate of officers and elders to be presented to the leader of the Nominating Committee.
- Initial board discussion regarding viability of Christmas Eve service during the pandemic.

25 Days of Gratitude Challenge


Try this Gratitude Challenge. Grown-ups can play too!
