koinə' nēə, noun: Christian fellowship

You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your ancestors, as it is today. (Deuteronomy 8:17-18, NIV)

Have you ever heard the phrase, "fake it until you make it?" If not, here's another way of saying it, "if you can't think your way into a better way of acting, then act your way into a better way of thinking." In other words, sometimes we have to take action we don't feel like taking and then we will feel like it later.

A great example of this is exercise and nutrition. Many times, we would rather sit on the couch and do nothing, eating potato chips or cookies. We don't want to take a walk around the block, or go to the gym, or eat something healthy. But if we just do those things anyway, whether we want to or not, then after a while we will actually want to do them. We are "faking it until we making it!"

The fake it until you make it principle, I find, works best with gratitude. After all, sometimes we just don't feel grateful. In times like these, when people are losing their jobs, when people are getting ill, when some people are being hospitalized and dying, it can be hard to feel grateful. But I can testify from experience, that if you force yourself to feel grateful, even if it doesn't feel genuine, then you will suddenly see all of the things you truly are thankful for and your gratitude will be authentic.

The reason this is true is because gratitude is actually not a reaction to one's circumstances, but a conscious *choice* we make. Let me make my case. Have you ever met someone that can find joy in any circumstance? These are the people who lose \$20 and think, "0 h boy! I sure hope someone who needs it more than me finds it!" Other people would let that ruin their day. What is the difference? And then there are people who find a way to be upset no matter what happens. These are the people who could win the lottery and complain about the taxes they will have to pay and the long-lost relatives who may come and try to get some of the money. Most others would be elat-

ed. What's the difference? We see that it ultimately has nothing to do with what does or doesn't happen; our attitude is a choice.

I challenge you to force yourself to be grateful, even if it feels fake at first. Try making a list of 10 things that you are grateful for. Even if you are in the middle of a streak of bad luck, I bet you can find 10 things. If you woke up on this side of the grass today, that's one. Try that every day for a week and I promise something terrific will happen. Suddenly, you will see more and more blessings and more opportunities for gratitude all around you.

God commands us to be grateful, not because God ego is so fragile that he needs our endless thank you's. It's because it's in our best interest. Almost all of human misery seems to come from an attitude of selfishness, self-righteousness, and pride. We and the people around us suffer when we think that we are the ones who provide for ourselves. When we adopt the posture of humble gratitude, we remember that God is God and we are not. We recognize that a God who has cared for us so much already in our lives is certainly not going to abandon us now. And we see that the reason we are blessed in the first place, with money, talents, personalities, work ethic, creativity, experiences, curiosity, etc. is not for our individual enjoyment, but rather so that we can let God use us to bless the community around us. But gratitude is the key.

This Thanksgiving season, I am so grateful. I am grateful for the best staff, the best congregation, the best community I could ask for as a pastor. And I am tickled pink that God trusts me so much to be so blessed. To you and your family, Happy Thanksgiving.

November Board Summary

• Financial Report:

- * Contributions exceeded budget for October. Contributions year to date are \$46,000.00 less than budget. Expenses are less than budget for October and less than budget year to date. Due to the endowment income and forgivable \$34,500.00 Small Business Loan via the Cares Act, the church is holding its own financially and we have no debt. The forgivable \$34,500.00 loan was used for salaries and utilities.
- * The treasurer met with Kentucky Utilities regarding billing of electricity. KU responded that our billing is at the lowest rate and there is no minimum billing. Electricity continues to be higher than budget due to an overestimate of savings from new HVAC system and a KU rate increase.
- * The Capital Campaign fund will be 0 by end of 2020, as money will be distributed to the Building Fund and Emergency Fund. Money was borrowed from these two funds to pay off the HVAC units in the CLC.
- * The Stewardship Campaign has been completed, with the number of commitments and the amount of giving less than last year.
- * Following review and discussion, the board approved the 2021 Budget as proposed by the Budget Team. Endowment income of \$125,304.00 will go to the operational budget, as there is no debt to apply it to. It is projected that the total revenue will exceed expenses by \$24,588.00 and this money will be placed in the Emergency Fund. The Maxine Maxey Fund endowment revenue is \$13,556.00 and the Ansel Herndon Fund endowment revenue is \$3096.00. 2021 Budget includes salary increases, disability insurance for staff, electricity increase, and outreach increase with three(3) additional programs.
- Property: Lights over the gym and walking track have been converted to LED lights. An estimate will be obtained for re-glazing and painting of windows in the sanctuary.
- Pastor Joey is in the process of determining how we can do a pre-recorded Christmas Eve service, due to the escalating Covid-19 pandemic.
- Discipleship: Mary Ann McGlothlin and Patty Wright are working on a mailing to all children regarding Advent and are developing a plan so that the children can get to know new Associate Pastor Catherine DeMoss, who will be here in mid-January, 2021.
- Personnel announced the hiring of Patricia Whaley, effective 12/1/2020, as the new Business Administrator, due to the upcoming retirement of Sherrie Cocanougher on 1/31/2021.
- Board approved slate of officers, ministry area coordinators, Elder officers, and slate of new Elders, effective January 1, 2021.
- A congregational meeting will be held on 12/6/2020, for the congregation to vote on the 2021 Budget and the 2021 church leadership (slate of officers, ministry area coordinators, Elder officers, slate of new Elders). Information will be placed in the Highlights and sent to the congregation. The process for voting will follow the same process as the last time, with several ways to vote by phone, by email, by mail, etc.
- Board approved the empowerment of the Maxine Maxey and World Outreach Committees to name the beneficiaries and to distribute \$40,000.00 in charitable giving by 12/31/2020.
