## Κοινωνία (Koinonia)

koinə nēə, noun: Christian fellowship

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. (Philippians 2:3-4, NIV)

Over the last few weeks, I have had the privilege of meeting with some of our leaders. I have sat down with board members, committee chairs, elders, and deacons. I can tell you with confidence that this congregation has much to be excited and confident about. The people who have accepted the call to lead our ministries of the church are enthusiastic and ready to make a big impact.

From my vantage point as pastor, I have seen how things have become increasingly more organized year by year, and how our dedication and work has multiplied. The work of this year could not be done without the success of last year, and the future depends upon what we accomplish this year. One specific thing that has impressed me is the development of functioning teams around each ministry that meet on a regular basis to discuss business and set a plan to get things done. Meetings are always saturated in prayer and seek above all things to discern and do God's will for FCC. I believe that we all have the capability of being leaders, and I think that each of us is called to leadership. That might not make a whole lot of sense at first glance, since leaders need followers. After all, if everyone leads, then who is left to follow? Well, not everyone leads everything. In other words, you might be a follower behind a leader in your church, but a leader in your home as a parent. In fact, I think the best leaders are good followers in other aspects of their lives.

There are many principles of effective leadership, and I believe we in the church are called to be aware of them, and to make sure that we are using the Bible as our guide. Leadership is not a title. Several years ago, I was at a training with several other people. The facilitator put us into groups of 8 people and then asked us to choose a leader in about 5 seconds. We quickly looked around the table until one person said, let's choose so and so. Everyone agreed unanimously. When we were asked who the leader was, the

designated person raised their hand. The facilitator then pointed out that we were mistaken. The leader was not the one given the title; the leader was the person who first spoke up and said we should choose that person, after which everyone agreed. In other words, leaders are those who other people follow. And the best leaders are the ones who other people want to follow.

Leadership is about trust. So often, it seems as though leaders are those who are supposed to "be in charge." They are characterized as those who tell us what to do and have the power to force us. Sometimes they are kind, sometimes not, but at the end of the day, they have the authority to boss us around. However, leadership is not about power and control. Leadership is about trust. A good leader earns the right to provide us direction that we are willing to follow because they have demonstrated through action over time that they have our best interests at heart. In a life or death situation, you want to follow the person you are confident is going to lead you to safety, not the one with the loudest bark.

Leadership is about character. One of the points I am adamant about when it comes to our elders in the church is that eldership is not defined by what someone does. In other words, being an elder is not a role with a job description of duties and tasks. Yes, there are specific things that elders do, but that is not what defines an elder. In other words, you can't just take anyone, teach them to pray at the Table and serve homebound communion and call them an elder. And elder is someone who displays exceptional character. The Bible describes an elder as one who is: "...above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money" (1 Timothy 3:2-3, NIV).

I am grateful to God that such leaders have been raised up in our congregation. I ask that all of you join me in prayer for these individuals and for God's blessings upon us.

#### **Ansel Hernden Fund**

Ansel Hernden was a prominent citizen of Danville and First Christian Church. He was a farmer, business man, and held several positions in FCC. He and his wife had one daughter, Marjorie, who still lives in Danville. She is married to Hugh Hines. Ansel was very passionate about FCC and cared very much about the facility and its upkeep. Therefore, upon his death in 2007 at the age of 98, he left a sum of money to the church and specified in his will that it be used only for the maintenance and upkeep of FCC facilities. This fund is part of the church endowment funds and is called Ansel Hernden Fund. This is an investment fund with Kentucky Trust Co., and the revenue is made part of the church budget each year, under the Property Committee as a Designated Fund. The revenue from this fund in 2019 was \$3,313.
