Pastor's Note

Dr. Carol Berkin, National Women's Historical Museum, writes of the most important unknown moment in American history during the single most important unnoticed gathering ever held in the United States. An offer was placed before America's foremost servant, Gen. George Washington, to take the title of "George I of the United States" toward the close of the Revolutionary War.

After the decisive victory over Cornwallis at Yorktown, the Continental Army quartered near Newburgh while terms to a peace treaty were drafted. Without a battle on which to concentrate, new thoughts were focused upon. Some states were failing to meet their obligations to their state veterans. Congress was in arrears in paying its own soldiers while standing amid the victory bought by their blood and sacrifice. Soldiers feared that Congress and state governments would simply disband their veterans and default on their promises. Newburgh Camp had become filled with bitterness with treason openly discussed.

The American Revolution had reached a stage many revolutions experienced where a dangerous power vacuum had grown in the transition between war and peace. The most worn path forward was for a strong leader to stop the slide toward chaos by wresting the situation to their will: Julius Caesar, Cromwell, Lenin.

All such individuals wrestled with their power to gain more power, but not George Washington. One of his officers, Lewis Nicola, wrote things would be better with him as king. Washington responded: "Be assured, Sir, no occurrence in course of the War, has given me more painful sensations than your information of there being such ideas existing in the army as you have expressed."

The imminent moment for military mutiny arrived on March 15, 1783. Gen. Washington unexpectedly entered his officers' assembly urging them to step down from their plans. His three-point oratory failed. As a final gesture, he tried reading a letter. Weary after eight years of bloodshed, he fumbled with eyeglasses never before seen—"Gentlemen, you will permit me to put on my spectacles, for I have not only grown gray but almost blind in the service of my country."

Spontaneous or thought out, this singularly unremarkable effort accomplished in a moment what all persuasion

failed to do. Major Samuel Shaw reported not an officer unmoved as he left, "There was something so natural, so unaffected, in this appeal as it rendered it superior to the most studied oratory."

The incident was a non-event which was more decisive than most celebrated events. The American Revolution would not go the way of other revolutions. Washington was as victorious over the temptation to power at Newburgh as he had been over the British.

Hyper-individualism is defined by sociologists: the tendency for people to act in a highly individual way, without regard to society. America's current climate is increasingly populated with individuals who reap the bounty of community - parks, public hospitals, utility systems, roads & bridges & airports. It's hard to understand increasing hyper-individualism when standing in the midst of all that community provides and then declare with sincerity in this land I have complete freedom to do as I please.

George Washington, and the balance of America's men and women founders, ensured a country where all would never be succeeded by the self-interest of one individual. In so doing, Washington fulfilled the spirit of what Paul taught the Galatians, "In Christ's family there can be no division into Jew and non-Jew, slave and free, male and female. Among us you are all equal. That is, we are all in a common relationship with Jesus Christ." (The Message Bible)

We will pile into the church van, and get clues every few blocks until we figure out our destination or arrive, whichever comes first. Bring a friend and come join the fun!


