As God has been pushing me in this direction, I have been spending more time myself in the Bible and I have started a virtual Bible Study. We are going through the Gospel of Matthew one small section at a time. I record and post a short (8-12 minute) video on YouTube and Facebook Tuesday through Friday. Then that link goes out in the Tuesday-Friday email at 4p.

Also, our world seems to be in disarray. Lately, we have seen again how our sisters and brothers have been suffering great pain and oppression because of the color of their skin, and this needs to stop. I believe that God has a Word that will correct and will heal. For this reason, it is important for disciples of Jesus to study the Bible and to proclaim what it says. We as Christians do not look to our politicians or the media to tell us what to believe and how to think. We look to scripture. And we follow Jesus wherever he takes us, knowing that it will be through the narrow gate, knowing that we will have few companions or friends on that path.

I don't enjoy ending this article on such a heavy note, but here it goes: it is time to immerse ourselves in the Bible, so that we can faithfully speak the Word of God into this world that needs it so. But the Bible is going to challenge you. It challenges me. The Bible is going to offend you. It offends me. But there is no other church than the one built on the rock of the Word. We must be prepared to live a life like that of Jesus, who was scorned, rejected, betrayed, abandoned and crucified. But remember always that our faith is in the God of the resurrection, and that our treasures are stored up for eternity in the Kingdom of Heaven.

#### Isaiah House Recognizes FCC

As a faithful monthly supporter of Isaiah House, FCC has been recognized as a charter member of the Lifesavers Club. Isaiah House is grateful for the consistent support and commitment in an effort to save lives, restore families, and improve community life across Kentucky.

#### **Endowment Funds**

Several years ago First Christian Church established an endowment fund for the church. It was established as a means for members or friends of the church to donate money or other property to the church as memorials, planned gifts, bequests, or beneficiary of life insurance policies. The FCC Endowment Fund is divided into two funds:

- Memorial Fund—This fund is established in the memory of the giver and will usually be named for that person. It may also have a specified use for those funds. The Ansel Herndon and Maxine Maxey Funds are examples of a Memorial Fund.
- Endowment Fund—This fund is established for givers with no particular designation of use for the funds. This fund is the major one of the two endowment funds and produces the most revenue for yearly use by the church. Any gift of \$100 or more with no designated use will be placed in this fund.

The church has a policy for administering the endowment funds of the church. A committee composed of a Trustee of the church, Sr. Minister, and two members in good standing of the church are designated by the Church Board to oversee and administer all of the endowment funds. The policy defines where the yearly revenue from the funds is to be distributed. A contribution to this fund can be made at any time, or bequeathed to the church with their will. All endowment funds of the church are invested through Kentucky Trust and Farmers National Bank.

A plaque is on the wall in the church arcade with the names of everyone who has given money to the Endowment Fund. There are 14 people listed, most of them leaving their contribution through their will.

## **Christian Women United**

To keep all our members safe, CWU officers have decided not to have their celebration on July 3rd as scheduled. The next gathering will not be scheduled until the governor and other authorities give the "go-ahead" to meet in large groups again.

Since Church Women United began as a movement of Prayer, Action, and Advocacy by Christian women, it is more than fitting that we continue in prayer, providing assistance to our Brothers and Sisters and be an advocate to others whenever possible. As our churches begin to formulate plans to worship across the internet or in person, we all promise to pray for everyone's health and safety and communicate as we move forward during these changing times.

# FCC Re-opening Update

Dear Church Family,

I hope this finds you well and safe. Our staff has been working extremely hard to keep us virtually connected and I commend their efforts as they've provided worship, studies, children's moments, hope and joy during our time of physical separation. FCC virtual services continue to have over 300 views per service each week. It appears we are reaching more people virtually than our average in-person attendance has been, a huge blessing that we are spreading the Word to many people. That said, many are missing traditional services and the in-person connection with our church family. We miss the fellowship and connective energy that we share together.

The re-opening team has been communicating regularly to form a plan for re-opening our building. The team is using resources and guidelines to develop the safest plan for in-person gatherings. The current timeline for re-opening our building is a "soft" opening in late June for small groups that utilize the facilities. Our target for in-person worship service is July 12th. We will monitor the situation and proceed with continuing to expand opening to more groups. Please understand that the plans are fluid and based on the current status of the virus and our community and may be adjusted as needed. Safety is and will continue to be the upmost priority for our church family.

New service roles are vital to the re-opening plan. Please be in prayer and consider whether you are willing and able to serve one of these roles on Sundays.

Our challenge going forward is how do we remain connected to the 300 plus viewers we currently have? How do provide worship for those that still cannot attend church in person? This challenge allows plenty of opportunity for our church to get creative and rethink how we do church. If we truly want to be "Disciples who make a difference", how does this look in our new normal? Please send any ideas to Joey and Donna.

How will you honor your father this year? Here are some ideas to start your thinking:


- •Color a picture of him


