People like Nancibel Rogers, Wanda B Coleman, Estelle W Pruitt, Charlie Hazelrigg, Woody Guerrant, Pauline Nolloth, Emma Kimberlin, Hiram A Morgan, Margie Hazelrigg, Ralph & Nancy Amos, and James Beazley. I hardly recognize any of these names. However, I am sure that long-time members of our church do recognize them. These people cared so much about this church that they left instructions that part of their estate would go to our church's endowment fund. They planted trees under which they will never sit.

I like looking to the future this way. And I like the power of compound interest! While most endowments are funded from estates after someone dies, I give a small monthly gift to the legacy fund of another church where I served as pastor. I like thinking that my little gift will be there FOREVER and will grow,

and the interest will always be used for the church that I love. Long after I am gone, that gift will continue to make a difference!

I am impressed with the management of the endowment funds for our church. We have excellent and specific policies regarding all the funds so there is never a debate about how they are to be used. And there is no possibility of them being misused.

Someone asked me once if this church ever considered spending the principal of the endowment funds, and I was shocked and replied, "Certainly not! The policies are very strict about that."

Our church endowments have benefited from compound interest and continue to provide a growing amount of resources for our congregation to maintain this lovely building, provide funds for outreach, and undergird a portion of our regular budget.

I'm glad there were people in our church willing to plant trees under whose branches they will never sit. We are enjoying the shade!

February Board Summary

The FCC Administrative Board met on Thursday, 2/17/2022 and the following are the highlights from the meeting:

- Financial Report: The January 2022 Balance Sheet, General Budget, and Restricted Funds documents
 were distributed, reviewed, and discussed. The total amount of our investment accounts is \$3,640,947.01.
 The church is on solid financial ground thanks to our Endowment and Memorial Funds and the growth of
 the funds due to sound investment practices. January 2022 pledges and offerings are \$7000.00 less than
 budget and expenses are on target.
- Personnel: Former Personnel Chair John Funkhouser, Julie Jones, and Dr. Anders met with new Personnel members Joey Kirk, Bart Gover, and Evelyn Guerrant. Joey Kirk was selected as Personnel's board representative. The new members were brought up to speed on outstanding personnel items and the work needed on FCC Handbook.
- Children's Ministries: Patti Wright provided information on Kid's Club, resumption of Worship & Wonder on 2/13/22, appreciation for nursery caregivers and ten (10) acolytes currently serving, and preliminary plans for Easter and Vacation Bible School.
- Associate Minister: Rev. Catherine DeMoss updated the board on the Baptism Class which has begun
 with 8 girls and female and junior mentors. Rev. Catherine reminded that our facility is an emergency shelter and warming center and a detailed emergency plan needs to be developed. Rev. Catherine and David
 May will take the lead on this.
- Senior Minister: Dr. Mickey Anders notified the board he is in touch with Rev. Joey Pusateri regularly and that Joey is considering starting a ministry in a room at Centre College. Dr. Anders announced and welcomed 2 new church members Scott and Nita Reisinger. 7 people have joined since 1/1/2022.
- Vince Pennington provided a summary of the Endowment Funds Annual Reports for 2019, 2020, and 2021 to the board, which includes the distribution amount and amount of return received on each fund. The full detailed reports were reviewed by the Endowment Committee.
- Senior Minister Search Committee has met and selected Elmer Jackson as the Chair. On 2/17/2022, Regional Minister Dr. Don Gillett met with the committee. The board and congregation will be informed of the general progress of the committee.
- The board approved the Vacation Policy for Part-Time Employees: Part-time salaried employees will receive 2 weeks of vacation. 3 weeks of vacation would be earned after 5 years of employment.
- The board approved an expenditure of \$200.00 to be made in memory and honor of Dr. Bill Hammond, former FCC minister, to the Week of Compassion.
- The Elders will review a request from shut-ins for weekly transportation to church and a request from McDowell Place to provide an in-person service once a month. Elder Chair Kendra Funkhouser presented the highlights of the Board Strategic Planning Session at the January Elders Meeting. The Elders' goal for 2022 is to focus on intentional spiritual initiatives.
- Outreach: Patricia Calvert reviewed a potential Outreach project called Greenhouse 17.
