Hope for the New Year

God's will for us is to live victoriously in this New Year. We can. We can live without hopelessness or fear or frustration in the year ahead if we recommit ourselves to Christ with confidence in his promises. To live in victory we need only to follow God's plan. We must realize each day is about being in relationship with Jesus.

People around the world have different unique New Year Day practices. In the Philippines there is the banging of pots and blowing horns to scare away malevolent spirits before they ruin the new year. In Greece there is the smashing of pomegranates against the front door symbolizing the smashing of bad luck and ensuring good fortune. Closer to home, many eat black-eyed peas to ensure a year of health and wealth. I knew someone who did that every single year. Once I asked, "You are doing fine but you have some health problems and you are not financially independent, so why do you keep eating black-eyed peas every New Year's Day?" The answer, "You're right, but just think how things would be if I didn't eat black-eyed peas on New Year's Day!"

In II Cor. 1:1-11 Paul deals with suffering. He certainly knew all about the subject personally and frequently. Exactly how did Paul live victoriously through every hardship? He relates how he's experienced a great deal of suffering. It's apparent the previous year had not been an easy one, but we see he's not lost any of the hope of salvation. He's confident because salvation isn't dependent on the conditions under which we live. Paul knew he had something the world couldn't take from because the world had not given it.

Do you have the assurance of salvation? You can. Certainly God wants you to be assured that you are secured by faith in Christ. Once we know we have redemption through Jesus, we can face a new year with assurance. Our salvation is made sure because it is anchored in Christ, and he is at the right hand of God.

Consider what Paul teaches in Romans 8 (MSG):29-30

God knew what he was doing from the very beginning. He decided from the outset to shape the lives of those who love him along the same lines as the life of his Son. The Son stands first in the line of humanity he restored. We see the original and intended shape of our lives there in him. After God made that decision of what his children should be like, he followed it up by calling people by name.

After he called them by name, he set them on a solid basis with himself. And then, after getting them established, he stayed with them to the end, gloriously completing what he had begun.

31-39 So, what do you think? With God on our side like this, how can we lose? If God didn't hesitate to put everything on the line for us, embracing our condition and exposing himself to the worst by sending his own Son, is there anything else he wouldn't gladly and freely do for us? And who would dare tangle with God by messing with one of God's chosen? Who would dare even to point a finger? The One who died for us—who was raised to life for us!—is in the presence of God at this very moment sticking up for us. Do you think anyone is going to be able to drive a wedge between us and Christ's love for us? There is no way! Not trouble, not hard times, not hatred, not hunger, not homelessness, not bullying threats, not backstabbing, not even the worst sins listed in Scripture:

They kill us in cold blood because they hate you. We're sitting ducks; they pick us off one by one.

None of this fazes us because Jesus loves us. I'm absolutely convinced that nothing—nothing living or dead, angelic or demonic, today or tomorrow, high or low, thinkable or unthinkable—absolutely nothing can get between us and God's love because of the way that Jesus our Master has embraced us.

Nothing - absolutely nothing - can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord! We do not lose our salvation - even when we are disobedient. What a relief! On a farm in the Caprock of the Texas panhandle, between Matador and Childress, had suffered a tornado. An insurance adjuster surveyed the damage on a farm. The adjuster noticed the tornado had lifted the windmill and placed it on its side about 50 feet away. He noted, "I see you lost your windmill." Uncle Floyd answered, "No sir, it's not lost, it just aint where I want it to be." We may not be where God wants us to be, or even where we want to be, but we haven't lost what he gave us. Our salvation is assured, sustained and kept by the Lord.

As a Christian, you can live in the New Year knowing that your salvation is secure in Christ.

Outreach Activities

Thank you FCC for your amazing response to needs in our community in December!

Angel Tree-The original 40 tags were claimed so quickly that some folks didn't get a chance to adopt an angel SO we added an additional 6. This means 46 children from our community will benefit from the clothes, toys, and other items purchased by FCC members. In addition, the Elders made a donation of \$400 that was used to purchase items needed by the Salvation Army office to complete bags for other children. And our FCC Children collected enough money through their weekly offerings to purchase clothes, toys and other items for two children bringing our Angel Tree total to 50!

Bell Ringing-We were grateful to have 20 FCC members ringing the kettle bell at Kroger on Dec.4 and/or Dec. 12. The sun was shining and your smiling faces kept those donations flowing into the kettle!

Waynesburg Manor Visit-On Dec. 7, Jan Bradshaw and her crew delivered a Christmas party, complete with caroling, gingerbread men, gifts from the Thursday morning bible study group and gifts purchased by FCC members. We were welcomed warmly by the residents, who seem to really appreciate our visits.

Coat Drive-Our congregation brought in approximately 65 adult and child-sized coats! The child-sized coats were taken to the Hogsett Primary School Resource Center, where the director would distribute coats to the other schools as needed. Several of the adult coats were taken to the Homeless Ministries of Sts Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Danville. A car load of coats was taken to the Kentucky Refugee Ministries office in Lexington, where there are many folks in need of winter wear.

Four Cans for Others-116 cans were brought in during December, making our grand total for 2023 to **1,421 cans!** Continue to bring in those cans AND be on the lookout for news of our food drive, coming in February, to help stock the supply for our food-insecure neighbors.

Holiday Food Boxes were provided to 22 Boyle County families: two large boxes filled with staple food items, a ham, turkey, gallon of milk, paper towels, toilet paper and holiday goodies. Recipients were recommended by Family Services of Boyle County.

Soups on Us prepared and delivered 307 meal boxes for the food insecure in the Danville/Junction City area in December. Twenty five of those meals were given to homeless individuals.

We have been blessed these past months to have Sisters from the Church of Latter Day Saints help with the Soups On Us Ministry. These young ladies have been assigned to Danville for their missionary work to help with community activities and help people become closer to Jesus's work.
