Unity

An unremitting tension has invariably existed within the church between how things have been done over time and what is required to move forward. Christians of every generation have been - and will continue to be - charged with determining what to faithfully retain and what is required to move past in the midst of different times.

Covid-19 safeguards for the well-being of an undivided church family, female clergy, integration, anti-Semitism, suffrage, environmental-based stewardship, fair trade, immigration, and slavery touch but a small number of the questions the Campbell-Stone Movement has encountered since the 1808 publication of Thomas Campbell's "Declaration and Address." Overall, this is just a small reflection of the whole Christian experience dating back to the apostolic church of the New Testament. The early church was strained over whether to incorporate Gentiles with equal standing with believers grounded in Judaism. Paul's Galatians 2:1-10 teaching reminds us of the oneness founded in Christ even when new or different manifestations of faithfulness arise.

Is unity achieved through being inextricably bound to Christ or to arbitrarily designated practices experienced since childhood?

The unity of the church is grounded in grace. The acknowledgment of the tie which binds hearts in Christian love is not ascribable to doctrinal consensus or via socially derived political correctness. Such practices inevitably define an entire congregation with imposed constraints. An inescapable consideration asks if such imposed

practices/traditions undermine the Gospel's message of grace. Is unity achieved through being inextricably bound to Christ or to arbitrarily designated practices experienced since childhood? Former Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams states, "Rather than unity, the slippery slope into a uniformity of narrow biblical interpretation, rigid and inflexible theology, and a highly judgmental morality; and those who fail to conform to this standard are given a negative label and marginalized."

Galatians 2:1-10 teaches the gospel produces a church of wide diversity. Paul struggles with unity amid the new and different. No mistake, standing decisively upright for the Gospel is primary. Unity focused upon the Gospel's message of grace must not be confused with meritless enforced unity based on things past. The unity of the church is understood. It is a spiritual reality bestowed by Jesus which acts to join everyone to him, and through him, to each other.

Paul was not accepting of an invisible unity. He personally traveled to Jerusalem and debated in a charged climate for the inclusion of Christian Gentiles. This issue generated emotions leading to conviction from both sides. Galatians 2:1-10 enables Christian unity when grace leads into unexplored areas of new life experiences. Christian unity is not unexamined tolerance or unthinking indifference slaved hidebound previous routine.

Openness to the different, or the new, is openness to God's unending revelation.

Update on Operation Recovery

Operation Recovery is the outreach project of Cross-Roads Mission aiding tornado victims in Western Kentucky, specifically Dawson Springs and Princeton. In 2022, CrossRoads Mission organized and lead volunteers who

- served approximately 120 tornado victims
- worked on 67 different jobs
- contributed 15,730 service hours with a labor value of \$314,600

In 2023 CrossRoads Mission plans to

- complete 18 new home constructions by the end of October
- complete 22 new home constructions by the end of December

Volunteers from First Christian Church will be working with CrossRoads Mission in Princeton, Kentucky April 23rd - April 28th. You can come for a day or two or the whole week. Choose whatever best fits your schedule. Don't feel like you have to be a carpenter to come along. There are skilled and unskilled tasks, and OJT.
